





Special Issue on Climate Change Solutions

SUBMISSION DEADLINE: JANUARY 10, 2021

The <u>Journal of Science Policy & Governance (JSPG</u>) and the United Kingdom Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office's Science and Innovation Network (<u>UK SIN</u>) are pleased to launch a joint call for papers for a special topics issue around **climate change solutions** aligned with the 2021 United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (<u>COP 26</u>) taking place in Glasgow, Scotland from November 1-12, 2021.

Students, post-docs, policy fellows, early career researchers and young professionals that meet <u>JSPG's</u> <u>submission guidelines</u> are encouraged to consider how public policies or governance structures could address global climate change via the lenses outlined in the priority areas below which are aligned. UK SIN and *JSPG* seek to engage a wide range of young voices, including but not limited to researchers, practitioners, NGOs, and industry representatives.

Best Paper Competition:

An expert review committee will identify <u>three best papers whose authors will be invited to present their work to leaders from the British Embassy</u>, followed by a forum about implementing policy solutions and engaging young people.

Priority Areas:

The competition will focus on three of the UK's priority areas for COP 26: **Adaptation and Resilience to Climate Change, The Transition to Clean Energy-Phasing Out Coal Power**, and **Nature-Based Solutions to Climate Change**. JSPG Submission Guidelines:

Eligible authors only need to meet **ONE** of the eligibility criteria below:

- Current students (undergraduate or graduate)
- Current policy fellows
- Postdoctoral associates
- Recent graduates within five years of earning a degree (bachelor's, master's, or doctoral)
- Early career professionals (those under the age of 30 at time of submission)

JSPG encourages submissions from all disciplines and professional backgrounds. Senior individuals may co-author submissions with eligible individuals providing the students or early-career researchers are the primary authors for the submissions.
